Division II

Offensive Player of the Week

**Erica Devito – Adelphi University
Sophomore, Attack, Shoreham, N.Y.**

Devito tallied 12 goals and four assists for 16 points on a 2-0 week for the Panthers. Against Merrimack, she tied her career best with eight goals and set a new Adelphi single-game points record with a total of 11 points. The previous record of ten points was set by Lauren Lopez '05 and tied twice by Rachel Ray '09. Devito also added five ground balls, one draw control, and three caused turnovers to her weekly tally.

Defensive Player of the Week

**Dominique Mosca – C.W. Post
Freshman, Goalkeeper, Merrick, N.Y.**

Mosca ensured a 19-7 victory for C.W. Post between the pipes against New Haven on Wednesday afternoon. Mosca played just over 34 minutes in net, making eight saves and allowing just two goals. She currently holds a .588 save percentage while averaging a mere 4.69 goals against.

Co-Offensive Players of the Week

**Danielle Cate – University of New England
Junior, Midfielder/Attacker, Boscawen, N.H.**

Cate scored a school-record nine goals to open up the week with a 22-12 win over Salve Regina, she also recorded three draw controls, two ground balls, and an assist in the contest. Cate followed up with six goals, one ground ball, one draw control, and a caused turnover in a 15-10 win over Southern Maine.

**Jamie Albert – Keene State College
Junior, Attack, Southington, Conn.**

Albert paced the Keene State attack this past week, scoring 18 points, on 11 goals and seven assists to lead the Owls to a 2-0 week. She netted at least a hat trick in victories over Division II Franklin Pierce and conference-rival Eastern Connecticut. Albert netted a season-best seven markers and handed out a pair of assists as Keene State snapped the Warriors' 21-game conference win streak on April 3. Earlier in the week, she used a balanced scoring attack with four goals and five assists in the victory over the Ravens.

Co-Defensive Players of the Week

**Sarah Warnke – Colby College
Junior, Goalkeeper, Lakeville, Conn.**

Warnke recorded 14 saves (.583 save percentage), with eight stops occurring in the second half and in overtime, in an 11-10 win at Middlebury on Saturday afternoon in the Mules' lone game last week. She

also scooped up seven ground balls and had a draw control. The victory was the 30th of her career at Colby, as she is now 30-6 over three seasons.

**Haley Erickson – Worcester State
Sophomore, Goalkeeper, Saugus, Mass.**

Erickson posted a 2-0 record in goal for Worcester State with 20 saves and a .513 save percentage, which included 11 stops in an 11-10 double overtime victory over UMass Dartmouth and nine saves and three ground balls in a 15-9 triumph over Becker.

Co- Offensive Players of the Week

**Sarah Bray – Hamilton College
Junior, Midfielder, Rockville, Md.**

Bray recorded 11 assists, two goals and nine ground balls in Hamilton's two Liberty League road wins last week. In a 17-7 win over Renssealer on Friday, Bray tallied a career-high six assists and scored two goals. She also picked up five ground balls and won one draw control. In 16-5 win over Vassar on Saturday, Bray earned five assists, recorded four ground balls, won two draw controls, and had two caused turnovers.

**Laura Dougherty – Keuka College
Junior, Attack, Geneva, N.Y.**

Dougherty had a strong offensive effort in leading the Storm to a 2-0 record for the week in NEAC play. Dougherty had nine goals on 11 shots, six assists and six ground balls for the week. In a win over Wilson College, Dougherty netted five goals and dished out four assists. She also had four goals and two assists in a win over SUNY-Morrisville as the Storm remains undefeated in conference action.

Defensive Player of the Week

**Ally Levy – SUNY Cortland
Freshman, Goalkeeper, Reistertown, Md.**

Levy helped lead the nationally ninth-ranked Red Dragons (6-1, 2-0 SUNYAC) to a pair of conference wins last week. In a 19-1 triumph versus Potsdam on Friday, she stopped six shots, recorded three ground balls and allowed just one goal. In a 17-4 victory at Oswego on Saturday, she made four saves. For the season, Levy has a 6-1 record with a 6.42 GAA, .516 save percentage and ten ground balls.

Division III Metro/South

Co-Offensive Players of the Week

**Blake Hargest – Franklin & Marshall College
Senior, Attack, Cockeysville, Md.**

Hargest scored nine goals and handed out two assists in a 2-0 week for the second-ranked Diplomats. She

had six goals and an assist in the 17-6 victory against Ursinus, bringing her within two points (298) of becoming the fifth player in conference history to record 300 career points.

**Justine Rothar – Farmingdale State College
Junior, Attack, Levittown, N.Y.**

Rothar scored four goals and had five assists for a game-high nine points in a 19-14 non-conference win over Manhattanville. Rothar has recorded 39 points in six games for Farmingdale State this season.

Co-Defensive Players of the Week

**Melissa Brashear – Catholic University
Senior, Goalkeeper, Pittsburgh, Pa.**

Brashear turned in a pair of strong performances as Catholic earned a pair of wins over nationally-ranked foes. She recorded 13 saves and added a ground ball while conceding only six goals in a win over 14th-ranked Williams. She then stopped eight shots while facing 29 shots as Catholic knocked off 16th-ranked Mary Washington. She averaged ten saves and had a 10.50 goals against average for the week.

**Jules Keeley – Kean University
Freshman, Goalkeeper, Ocean Township, N.J.**

Keeley surrendered just one goal in 90 combined minutes of play in a pair of victories during the week for the Cougars. She opened the week by surrendering just one goal in 60 minutes of action while collecting ten saves in Kean's first NJAC win of the year, a 16-1 road victory at Rutgers-Camden. Two days later, she surrendered no goals in 35 minutes of play during the Cougars' 19-1 non-conference win over Bard. Keeley currently ranks fourth in the NJAC in goals against average (7.66).
